

**Borough Council Meeting Minutes
Borough of New Cumberland
Wednesday, July 13, 2022**

The New Cumberland Borough Council held its regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, July 13, 2022, in the Council Chambers of the Borough building located at 1120 Market Street, New Cumberland, PA.

- 1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag — The meeting was called to order at 7:00p.m. and the group was led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag by the Council President Robert P. Kline.

- 3. Approval of June 08, 2022, Council Meeting Minutes and June 22, 2022, Special Council Meeting Minutes — A motion was made by Vice-President Kibler, seconded by Councilwoman Richie to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of June 08, 2022. All were in favor. MOTION carried.

6. Hear Visitors —

George Labecki, 1707 Charles Street, expressed his concerns regarding loud music coming from across the river until late hours of the night. He stated that complaints have been made to the Harrisburg Police Department due to the location of the problem being out of New Cumberland's jurisdiction. President Kline stated that he would meet with Police Chief Spadaccino, Mayor Eisenhower and Borough Manager to find a solution to address the issue.

Blair Lawrence, 1009 Oak Lane, expressed her gratitude for the approval of the New Cumberland Pride Special Event. She proceeded to promote the event which will be held in the Borough Park on July 23rd with a rain date of July 24th starting at noon until 5:00pm.

Steve Fleming, 618 Bridge Street, explained that Re/Max Pathway is hosting a fundraiser for the Children's Miracle Network. He stated he originally wanted to host the Cornhole Tournament at Memorial Field, but upon discussion, found that it was not large enough for what was planned. Instead, the event will be organized with the help of Medard's House in order to utilize their property.

Rebecca Diehl, 1805 Charles Street, expressed similar concerns as Mr. Labecki regarding the loud music coming from across the river and would like to see it addressed.

7. President's Report

-Council President

A. Planning Commission Vacancy Updates — Vice-President Kibler stated that there are two (2) vacancies on the Planning Commission Board. He said there is roughly six (6) or seven (7) candidates that have either submitted a letter of interest or have expressed an interest in the Planning Commission. Vice-President Kibler also mentioned he would like to fill these vacancies sometime in the near future upon reviewing what the Borough has currently received.

B. Consideration of Family Movie Night Special Event Application — A motion was made by Councilman Stone, seconded by Councilwoman Richie to approve Family Movie Night at Will Cole Park on July 30, 2022, from 8:00pm until 10:00pm. All were in favor. MOTION carried.

C. Downtown Handicapped Parking Request Letter — Upon the Council's discussion of the Handicapped Parking Request, President Kline stated that the consultants of the Downtown Master Plan should be notified of this so that it can be determined whether the request is feasible. No motion was made but all of Council was in agreement.


