

**Borough Council Meeting Minutes
Borough of New Cumberland
Wednesday, August 10, 2022**

The New Cumberland Borough Council held its regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, August 10, 2022, in the Council Chambers of the Borough building located at 1120 Market Street, New Cumberland, PA.

1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag — The meeting was called to order at 7:00p.m. and the group was led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag by the Council President Robert P. Kline.

3. Approval of July 13, 2022, Council Meeting Minutes — A motion was made by Councilman Wilson, seconded by Councilwoman Richie to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of July 13, 2022. All were in favor. MOTION carried.
4. Approval of Disbursements for July 2022 — A motion was made by Councilman Wilson, seconded by Councilwoman Landis to approve the Disbursements for the month of July 2022. All were in favor. MOTION carried.
5. Approval of Treasurer’s Report for July 2022 — A motion was made by Councilman Wilson, seconded by Vice-President Kibler to approve the Treasurer’s Report as presented. All were in favor. MOTION carried.

6. Hear Visitors —

Garry Brinton, 319 Eleventh Street, explained that one of his neighbors has a rooster and is woken up in the early morning to rooster noise. He explained that he has tried installing sound barriers within his house, but it has not helped block the noise out. Chief Spadaccino stated that the Police Department handles these disturbances and advised Mr. Brinton to call when it is happening, this way the issue can be addressed at that time.

Steven Garistel, lives in Pennbrook, explained his shock when he heard indecent language used at a recent poem reading held on Library property because there were small children present and felt that type of language is unnecessary considering the location. He also proceeded to explain his concerns about allowing LGBTQ+ events at the West Shore Theatre as well as the Borough Park.

7. President's Report

-Council President

A. Consideration of Appointments to Planning Commission — President Kline stated there are two (2) vacancies open and the time has come to decide who will take these seats. A motion was made by Councilwoman Richie, seconded by Councilwoman Landis to appoint Ira Beckerman for the 2024 term.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Landis, seconded by Councilwoman Richie to appoint George Estep for the 2022 term. All in favor. MOTION carried.

B. Adoption of DEP Stormwater Management Ordinance #712 — Manager Dysard stated that the ordinance was authorized for advertisement at the last Council Meeting and has been advertised according to law. A motion was made by Councilman Miles, seconded by Vice-President Kibler to adopt the DEP Stormwater Management Ordinance #712. All in favor. MOTION carried.

C. Setting Trick-or-Treat Date and Time for 2022 — A motion was made by Vice-President Kibler, seconded by Councilman Wilson to approve Trick-or-Treat night for Thursday, October 27th, 2022, at 6:00pm until 8:00pm with a rain date of Monday, October 31st, 2022, at 6:00pm until 8:00pm. All in favor. MOTION carried.

D. Consideration of Third Avenue Drainage Improvements Project Bid — Manager Dysard stated that only one bid was received and suggested to reject the bid. A motion was made by Councilman Wilson, seconded by Vice-President Kibler to reject the Third Avenue Drainage Improvements Project Bid. All in favor. MOTION carried.

8. Engineer's Report — Engineer Watt's was absent but provided a written report in advance for the month of July 2022.

9. Municipal Service Agreement of Traffic and Control Signals — President Kline stated that PA PERCS is closing, and a new company will need to be appointed. A motion was made by Councilman Miles, seconded by Vice-President Kibler to add the Municipal Service Agreement of Traffic and Control Signals to the agenda.

A motion was made by Vice-President Kibler, seconded by Councilman Wilson to approve the Municipal Service Agreement of Traffic and Control Signals with Atlantic Transportation Signals. All in favor. MOTION carried.

10. Mayor's Report — Mayor Eisenhower provided a verbal report for the month of July 2022.

11. Police Chief's Report — Chief Spadaccino provided a written report of the Police Department activities for the month of July 2022.
12. Fire Chief's Report — Chief Gouldy provided a written report of the Fire Department activities for the month of July 2022.
13. Solicitor's Report — Solicitor Cassidy stated that there are updates with the I-83 south Bridge Project. He explained that the Legislature amended law, so that if the project moves forward, mandatory tolls will not be allowed.
14. Manager's Report — Manager Dysard provided a written and verbal report of the activities within the Borough for the month of July 2022. Wednesday, August 24, 2022, at 6pm the Downtown Master Plan will be discussed with the public at the West Shore Theatre.
15. Other Officials and Committee Reports — Nothing to report.
16. Adjournment — A motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Wilson, seconded by Vice-President Kibler. All were in favor. MOTION carried. The New Cumberland Borough Council meeting adjourned at 8:02p.m.
