A motion was made by Councilman Wilson, seconded by Councilman Miles to appoint Rebecca Parthemore to the Zoning Hearing Board. All in favor. MOTION carried.

President Kline discussed putting a committee together to fill the Library Board vacancies. Vice-President Kibler, Councilwoman Landis, and Councilman Stone were assigned to the committee. President Kline requested that, at the next Library Board meeting, the Library Board suggest to the Borough two (2) members from the board to serve on the committee.
